Rule #11 Appearances in Children in Need of Protection and Services (CHIPS) and Juveniles in Need of Protection and Services (JIPS) Proceedings by Incarcerated Party

1101:

Effective date: December 1, 2018

1102:

If a party is incarcerated in a county jail, a state prison, or a federal prison, the party may request to appear by video conference from such facility. Such requests must be made to the Juvenile Clerk of Lincoln County at least seven (7) calendar days prior to the scheduled hearing for which the party desires to appear by video conference. Such requests must be made to the Juvenile Clerk by U.S. Mail, personal delivery from someone of behalf of the incarcerated person, E-filing, or by fax.

1103:

A request to appear by video conference must be made for each hearing in the manner indicated in this paragraph, unless such request has been made during a previous court proceeding.

1104:

Whether or not a video conference request can be accommodated will be dependent on the availability to do so by the jail or prison where the party is incarcerated.
